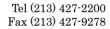

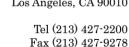

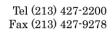


#### STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

You have the right to cancel your program of instruction, without any penalty or obligations, through attendance at the first session or the seventh (7) calendar day after enrollment, whichever is later. After the end of the cancellation period, you also have the right to stop school at any time; and you have the right to receive a pro rata refund if you have completed 60 percent or less of the hours scheduled in the current payment period in your program through the last day of attendance.

- 1) Cancellation may occur when the student provides a written notice of cancellation at the following address: CBD College, 3699 Wilshire Blvd., Fourth Floor, Los Angeles, CA 90010. This can be done by mail or by hand delivery.
- 2) The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with proper postage.
- 3) The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, it is effective if it shows that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the Enrollment Agreement.

- "Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- "Number of Graduates Taking Exam" is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- "First Available Exam Date" is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- "Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- "Number Who Passed First Available Exam" is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- "Salary" is as reported by graduate or graduate's employer.
- "No Salary Information Reported" is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.



#### STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

You have the right to cancel your program of instruction, without any penalty or obligations, through attendance at the first session or the seventh (7) calendar day after enrollment, whichever is later. After the end of the cancellation period, you also have the right to stop school at any time; and you have the right to receive a pro rata refund if you have completed 60 percent or less of the hours scheduled in the current payment period in your program through the last day of attendance.

- Cancellation may occur when the student provides a written notice of cancellation at the following address: CBD College, 3699 Wilshire Blvd., Fourth Floor, Los Angeles, CA 90010. This can be done by mail or by hand delivery.
- 2) The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with proper postage.
- 3) The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, it is effective if it shows that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the Enrollment Agreement.
- 4) If the Enrollment Agreement is cancelled the school will refund the student any money he/she paid, less a registration or administration fee not to exceed \$75.00, and less any deduction for equipment not returned in good condition, within 45 days after the notice of cancellation is received.
- 5) Cancellations due to denial of an applicant: If an applicant is denied enrollment by the institution, or if a prospective international student has his/her visa application denied, a full refund of all tuition and fees paid will be made to the applicant.
- 6) Cancellations due to program cancellation: If the institution cancels a program subsequent to a student's enrollment, the institution will refund all monies paid by the student.
- 7) Cancellation Prior to the Start of Class or No Show: If an applicant accepted by the institution cancels prior to the start of scheduled classes or never attends class (no-show), the institution will refund all monies paid, less a registration or administration fee not to exceed \$75.00.
- 8) Cancellation after the start of class: The policy for students who cancel after the start of the class are stated in the foregoing No. 1 of this section.
