Definitions

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

A student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.

Additionally, OCU allows students to terminate their enrollment agreement and receive a 100% refund on their tuition if the withdrawal is completed up to and including the Friday after 10 semester class days.
