- REFUND POLICY—WITHDRAWAL PRIOR TO COURSE COMPLETION: Once the student has been determined by the institution to have withdrawn from the course of study, refund policy calculations are performed under the two distinctive and different calculation formulas: The Institutional Refund Policy applicable to all students.

-INSTITUTIONAL REFUND POLICY: After the cancellation period, the institution will provide a pro-rata refund of ALL funds paid for tuition charges to students who have completed 60 percent or less of the period of attendance.
