STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first-class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later (except the registration fee). The STRF Assessment is non-refundable after the Program Start Date.

Should California Career Institute cancel a class after a student has been accepted, all money paid by that student shall be refunded in full, including the registration fee. A notice of cancellation shall be communicated to the institution, and a withdrawal may be effectuated by the student's written notice or by the student's conduct, including, but not necessarily limited to, a student's lack of attendance per the institution's attendance policy. Students not accepted by the school and students who cancel this contract by notifying the school through attendance at the first class session, or during the seven days after enrollment, whichever is later, are entitled to a refund of 100 percent of the amount paid for institutional charges (except the registration fee).

In the case of students withdrawing after the end of the cancellation period, the refund policy for students who have completed 60 percent or less of the period of attendance shall be a pro rata refund. STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first-class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later (except the registration fee). The STRF Assessment is non-refundable after the Program Start Date.

Should California Career Institute cancel a class after a student has been accepted, all money paid by that student shall be refunded in full, including the registration fee.
